Dear GTMF Supporter,



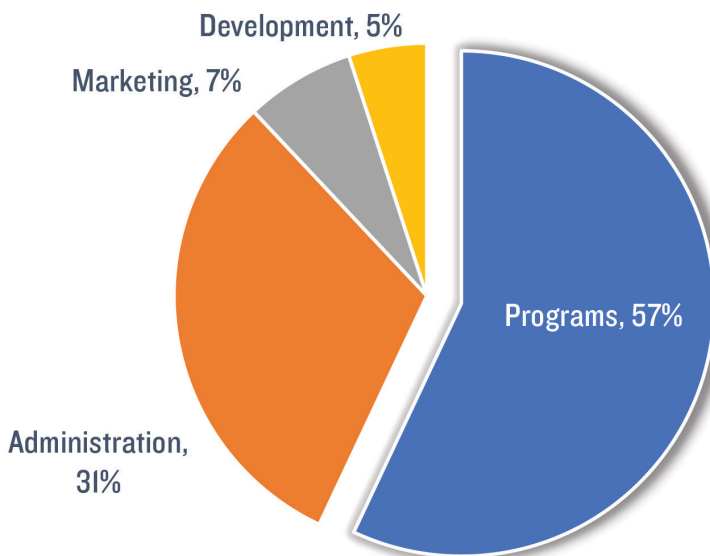

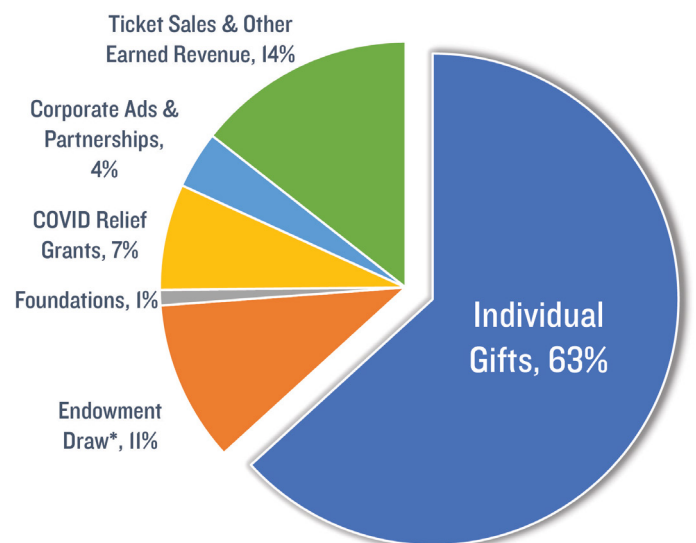
